What is UNEA?

- World's highest decision-making body on the environment
- Meets every 2 years in Nairobi to set priorities for global environmental policies and develop international environmental law
- 2 important categories of tools: **resolutions** & ministerial **declaration**



- 3. Strengthening **ocean** and seas governance to tackle climate change, marine biodiversity loss and pollution



Preparation of the INC-4 on plastic pollution

The fourth session of the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee to develop an international legally binding instrument on plastic pollution, including in the marine environment (INC4, Ottawa, 21-30/04/24)



In the preparation, PRES BE aims to:

- Further develop EU positions
- Make progress on technical aspects (informal intersessional work)
- Find convergence and compromise with third countries

During INC-4, PRES BE aims to:

- Enter the textual negotiations
- Keep all options for an ambitious treaty on the table
- Defend EU positions and convince other parties to align with them
- Leave Ottawa with a text enabling negotiations to be finalized at INC-5
- Mandate intersessional work to inform the INC on technical aspects



BE and EU priorities for a future treaty

Setting clear and ambitious goals

- End plastic pollution to protect HH and the environment
- Global rules and specific targets throughout the entire life cycle of plastics
- Level playing field
- Mandatory implementation, common reporting and effective compliance system

Transition to a circular plastics economy

- Prevention, reduce, reuse, recycle
- Design and substances/polymers of concern, including microplastics
- Problematic and avoidable plastics
- Environmentally sound management of plastic waste
- Extended producer responsibility schemes (EPR)

Engaging existing/future knowledge

- Involve various stakeholders
- Scientific research
- Education and awareness-raising

Financial empowerment

- Public and private means
- Marked-based instrument, EPR

UN Convention to Combat Desertification: EU as 'affected party'

- Ongoing proposal for the EU to declare itself as an 'affected Party' under UNCCD
- Member States' position to be discussed within WPIEI Desertification under Belgian Presidency
- Belgian consultations foreseen in Q1
