




This new regulation aims to:

- Reduce the generation of packaging waste
- Promote a circular and safe economy for packaging
 - Harmonise packaging rules

Ambient Air Quality Directive: enhanced EU air quality standards for 2030 in the form of more stringent limit and target values that are closer to the WHO guidelines and that will be regularly reviewed.

Waste Framework Directive (food and textile waste) main outcomes and takeaways

Food waste:

- Ambition level for food waste reduction targets is kept
- Review should look into methodology to measure edible food waste
- Tourism and production level correction factor
- Choice of reference years
- Study on food waste and losses in primary production

Textile waste: extended producer responsibility

- Inclusion of micro enterprises
- Review by end 2028 to consider setting targets
- Sufficiency of EPR schemes cost coverage, especially with regard to 2nd hand products becoming waste in another Member State
- Clarifying the role of Social Economy Entities
- Clarifying the concept "assessed as fit for reuse"
- Option to take into account fast fashion practices in establishment of the fee
