UNEA Resolution 5/14

→ UNEP Executive Directive: convene **intergovernmental negotiating committee** (INC) to develop an **international legally binding instrument** (ILBI) on plastic pollution

Scope:

- Life-cycle approach
- Including in the marine environment (but not limited to it)
- Binding and non-binding elements
- Principles: Rio Declaration on Environment and Development, respect for national circumstances and capabilities
- Just transition
- Stakeholder engagement
