1 United Nations Strategic Plan for Forests (2017-2030)

- ► Target 1.1 : The forest area is increased by 3 per cent worldwide
- ▶ Set of global and shared objectives
- As reference framework for all forest-related work in the UN system

2. UNFF - what?

- ▶ A holistic approach is necessary for forest policy
 - As forests provide economical, social and environmental benefits
- Main objectives:
 - Promoting the sustainable management of forests
 - Fostering coherence and commitment on the highest policy level
 - Forum for policy debate

4. Challenges

- ▶ Forum struggles to get message across
- ▶ Fails to deliver on very practical results 'on the field'
- ▶ Difficulties with reporting
 - → E.g. limited voluntary national contributions in reporting
- ► Limited visibility and political influence due to competition with other fora and processes

History

- ▶ 1992 Rio Earth Summit: 'forest convention' blocked due to two bones of contention
 - × Forests as a sovereign national resource rather than common good
 - × Transfer of finance & technology
