Background

- 2019, UNEA-4
 - science is needed to set priorities, for policy-making & monitor progress
 - science-based decision-making should be promoted at all levels
 - science-policy interface (SPI) needs to be strengthened
- 2022, The Lancet Planetary Health revealed that
 - pollution is responsible for one in 6 deaths worldwide, 9 million deaths per year
 - Pollution is largest environmental risk factor for disease and premature death
 - Little progress against pollution despite efforts by committed agencies
 - Highlight recommendations to address Triple planetary crisis (climate change, biodiversity & pollution)
- 2022, UNEA-5.2, resolution 5/8
 - "Science-policy panel to contribute further to the sound management of chemicals and waste and to prevent pollution"

This resolution supports the establishment of a comprehensive and ambitious science policy panel to contribute further to the sound management of chemicals and waste and to prevent pollution.

The core functions of the SPP

- undertake **horizon scanning** to identify issues of relevance to policy makers and propose evidence-based options
- conduct **assessments** of current issues and identify potential evidence-based options, in particular those relevant to developing countries
- provide up-to-date and relevant information (and identify key gaps in scientific research)
- and finally **facilitate information sharing**, in particular with developing countries seeking relevant scientific information.
- (Capacity building)

- 1st session Part 2 Bangkok 30 January to 3 February 2023.

- 3rd and final session 17 to 21 June 2024 in Geneva. Belgium coordination EU+MS
